### **LA Appointed**

Authority governors are appointed by the local authority. Normally they are appointed because of their commitment to raise standards at the school.

### **Non Teacher / Staff Governor(s)**

Staff governors are elected by the school staff to represent their interests on the governing body. Both teaching and support staff paid to work at the school are eligible to be staff governors.

### **Parent Governor(s)**

Parent governors are elected by parents of pupils on the school roll at the time of election. They must be parents of pupils on the school roll themselves to stand for election. Parent governors do not have to stand down if their child leaves the school, though they may do if they wish. They may stand for re-election at the end of their term of office if they still have a child on the school roll. If not enough parents stand for election, parent governors may be appointed by the governing body.

### **Associate members**

Associate members can be appointed by the governing body to serve on one or more governing body committees and attend full governing body meetings.

Associate members can be school staff, pupils or people who contribute specifically on issues related to their area of expertise. However, they are not governors and are therefore not recorded on the Instrument of Government. They can have limited voting rights.
