

**This term in class we are learning about...**

- Literacy – Narrative writing. Class book – Friend or Foe by Michael Morpurgo. Linked to our WWII topic with a focus on evacuees. We will also focus on the children's grammar and punctuation skills.
- Numeracy – mental and written mathematical skills using the four number operations: + - x and ÷. Standard written methods for calculations, fractions, decimals and percentages and many more things to stretch and challenge the children.
- Science – Electricity, Sound and Plants
- RE – What is the best way for a Muslim to show commitment to God?
- History – The Impact of War. Looking at the effects on community during WWI and WWII.
- Geography – Our World In The Future. We will also be looking at land use and maps linked to our John Muir Award.
- Computing – Systems and Networks and Programming

- D&T – Monitoring and Control
- Art – A World War II project based around sculptor Henry Moore
- PE – Yoga and tag rugby
- RHE – Family and Relationships
- Spanish – At School
