## SEND Coffee Morning



### **Spring term:**

It has been another busy Spring term at Lawley and there has been lots to celebrate.

Our **Inclusion and Wellbeing Council** have continued to work hard, sharing important messages with the school. During Children's Mental Health Week, they delivered an assembly that taught pupils ways to protect their mental health. They also set a wellbeing challenge that included: noticing nice things, breathing to help relax, moving more, talking and completing acts of kindness.

During Spring 2, the council considered their next project and in an assembly on the last day of term, they explained to the school what they intend to work on.

Over the summer, the council are planning to develop a **sensory garden** that will help some of our school community remain calm over lunchtime. This will be a place to visit if children need a calm space. The team will launch this project in April to celebrate and recognise 'Autism Acceptance Month'. During the session, we welcomed Ceri Hurst, our learning support advisory teacher (LSAT) who talked about interventions and provision. ### External services:

This year, we continue to work with Dr Daniel Cumber as our school's supporting Educational Psychologist and Ceri Hurst as our Learning Support Advisory Teacher (LSAT).

### School Support Maps:

If your child is on the SEND register, you should have received a cycle B support map. This shows your child's targets for Spring 2 and Summer 1. These targets will be reviewed at the end of May, and a Cycle C map will be sent home with new targets.

### Rainbow Circles:

This term, your child may have talked to you about 'Rainbow Circles'. Following some whole school training in **Theraplay**, children now engage in a Rainbow circle each week. These sessions include fun and engaging activities that are planned carefully to consider: structure, engagement, nurture and challenge. The sessions aim to help children understand relationships, support emotional regulation, strengthen relationships, and give time for reflection.
